#### My Life as Government Liaison, 2017 Treasurer, and incoming President for ClBike

I am very much looking forward to 2018 and continuing the fun, growth, and influence of the Channel Islands Bicycle Club. Our club was founded to "promote bicycling as a means of recreation, health, sport and transportation." We do this in many ways; through our regular bike rides, monthly club meetings, participation in community meetings, support of community cycling events, and providing funds to organizations and agencies to support cycling.

The club has two sources of income; membership dues and the Cool Breeze Century. As a non-profit 501 (c)4 organization, there are regulations that CIBike must follow. The issue of accounting and expenditures became somewhat contentious in 2017. The Board and I spent a considerable amount of time researching IRS requirements and talking with the Club's CPA. As most of us thought, CIBike has been in compliance with IRS requirements. The net earnings, regardless of source, of the Club must be devoted primarily to promoting bicycling. Membership and Cool Breeze income provide the gross income of CIBike. After administrative expenses, the remaining funds are CIBike's "net earnings" and these are the monies that must "predominantly" be spent to promote bicycling. Our Club has always predominantly spent net earnings to support bicycle advocacy, infrastructure for cyclists, education, and bicycle safety equipment. All members of CIBike can be proud of our contributions to improving conditions for road cyclists locally and nationwide.

The 2017 Board also focused on revision of the Club's By-Laws which were over ten years old. Several events during the year made it apparent that the By-Laws needed to be clearer regarding announcements of openings on the Board and the scheduling of Board meetings. The new, more democratic By-Laws will be in effect as of January 1.

Life as a CIBike Government Liaison (shared with Leslie Ogden) has become much busier due to the expanding focus of local and state agencies on improvement of bicycle infrastructure. As all of you, who have been responding to the calls to attend city council and county supervisor meetings, know there has been a lot of focus on increasing funding and improving policies to support bicyclists. We really appreciate the willingness of Club members to turn out in CIBike kits and show that local people care about cycling.

Being a Government Liaison has been especially satisfying this year. We've seen a number of improvements for cyclists in large part because our Club members have stepped up.

- ) Our members came out to the Ventura City Council in support of the League of American Bicyclists' awarding Ventura Bike Friendly City status, bronze level. Our council members were clearly surprised and impressed that this mattered to so many people.
- Similarly, a BIG body of CIBikers came to the Ventura County Board of Supervisors and were likely the deciding factor in the Board's decision to fund <u>all</u> its priority bike projects.
- Our Club members came out to show support for Supervisor Bennett's efforts to make all cities in this county bike friendly. This effort is ongoing but very promising.
- CIBike and Midtown Ventura Council members came to Ventura's City Council <u>twice</u> in support of Five Points improvements in Ventura. After initial reluctance, the council unanimously supported these plans. The project goes for bid very soon.

A number of individuals jumped in to help Kate and me with long term projects as well.

- Bill Faulkner and Patrick VanHorn joined us on the Ventura Bike Advisory Board set up by the City of Ventura's Bike Coordinator and CIBike member, Derek Towers, for ongoing communication with cyclists. Upcoming paving and striping (read bike lane) projects: Telegraph, Telephone, Portola and Petit.
- Diane Stein applied her boundless energy to Cycle Cal Coast set up by the Santa Barbara and Ventura Supervisors Carbojal and Bennett to make this area an internationally recognized cycling destination.

To cap off a perfect year (and proof that Cycle Cal Coast has got it right) the Tour of California is coming to Ventura to start its second leg! Kate and I are the volunteer coordinators for this amazing event. We hope you'll be part of the team of 150-200 volunteers needed to run it! Mark your calendars for May 14!

As of December 1st, Club membership stands at 273 total. This includes 130 individuals and 129 households. In addition, there are 14 individuals with lifetime membership. Some, having attained 80 years of age and beyond. Others, per special decision by the Board that was in charge several years back, for their invaluable services in establishment of the Club.

Although 43 new members have joined the Club since January 1st, regrettably a number of existing members are not active in membership renewal in spite of repeated inquiry by membership manager and having been given many opportunities to provide feedback.

On another front, it was decided by unanimous Board decision to relocate Club's mailing address from Oxnard to Ventura. This makes much sense as the Club's core membership and activities are concentrated in the city of Ventura.

## Are you a smart rider? By Derek Towers

City of Ventura Transportation Here is a short bit of education that you may not know about. This is in part to introduce the City of Ventura Bicycle Street Smart classes. They are held monthly, costing \$20, but upon completion you receive a certificate and bike light, lock or helmet.

First knowledge tidbit. We have all heard of California's 3 Foot law. Vehicles are required to pass cyclist with 3' between them. What you may not know is that this does not apply when you are riding in a bike lane. Next tidbit. Did you know that it is legal to ride on the sidewalk in all of Ventura? The two exceptions are Downtown and the mall. In the classes I tell everyone, if you are ever going to ride on the sidewalk, you should travel at pedestrian speeds, because that is everyone expectation. Last

tidbit. There are certain signals in the City of Ventura that have sensors to detect bicycles. How do you know which ones? Keep an eye out for this symbol up near the limit line. If you see video on the top of the signal arms, those will detect you also. Stay safe out there.
