First and foremost, a big thank you to our past President Diane Stein and the 2023 Board for a stellar 2023. We are fortunate to have several former Board members remaining on board as we benefit from their experience and history with the club.

Channel Islands Bicycle Club is off to a great start in 2024. I am impressed by the commitment and enthusiasm of current board members as we strive to provide our members the support, education, experiences and camaraderie we are known for.

The year started with lots of severe weather challenges and resultant road closures, mudslides, potholes, and the need to make frequent changes to our regularly scheduled routes. Our Rides Director and ride leaders have done an excellent job staying informed of these hazards and posting new ride information on the Rides Forum and Calendar on cibike.org.

Our Year Rounder program has over 40 participants who are busy pedaling their metrics each month. One of our four supported 100-mile rides was held March 9th and three more are scheduled throughout the year.

Time to reflect, engage, educate, rejuvenate May Is National Bike Month



National Bike Month is a celebration of cycling held every May in the U.S., sponsored by the League of American Bicyclists. In years past, CIBike participated in several special events to recognize National Bike Month. CIBike supported Ride of Silence events and rode along with a team of Navy Wounded Warriors as they trained for a national competition. The ride of Silence was created to raise awareness of bicycle safety and the need to share the road as well as to honor cyclists who have been injured or killed while riding on public roads. Other events included Bill and Kate supporting the Ride to Work Day.



Ride Ready Bicycle Training By Bill Faulkner

The City of Ventura, BikeVentura, and Trek Ventura are offering free-to-the-public bike programs. This one-day (4 hour) skill course is your chance to learn safety, maintenance, and bike handling. Our skilled instructors will help you gain greater confidence and have more fun on your bike rides.

This class is for adults who can ride a bike, or adult-accompanied children. The program includes classroom session, on-bike skills training, and a group ride on carefully selected city streets. Even the most experienced bicyclists are going to learn important skills, such as:

- Proper Bike and Helmet Fit
- Riding safely, visibly and predictably with traffic
- Communicating with car drivers
- Your rights and responsibilities on the road
- Emergency Maneuvers
- Across-Town Route Selection
- What to bring on every ride
- Fix a flat, maintain your bike and more!

I am pleased to report that CIBike has awarded nine grants so far during 2024!

Grant checks have been awarded to four Boys and Girls Clubs in the Santa Paula area, two grants to Bike Ventura, one grant to Project Bicycle Love, one grant to the Newbury Park Mountain Bike team, and one to the Venture Boy Scout Team in Simi Valley.

Grant presentation to Santa Paula area Boys and Girls Clubs

On March 5, Kurt, Director at Large, and I were joined by three of the four Santa Paula area Boys and Girls Club Directors for ClBike Grant check presentations. The Santa Paula facility was amazing! Jan Marholis, the Site Director, goes above-and-beyond in securing grants in order to give the club's youth engaging academic and social activities. We toured the facility and observed older youth engaged in an after-school homework session, younger youth actively engaged with electronics, and another group of youth working with volunteer artists creating clay animation short films. Our grant will provide a bike rack at each site, and helmets, lights, locks, and reflectors for youth commuting to the clubs by bicycle. CIBike Grants Have an Impact!

CIBike Grants have an impact. CIBike funded grants brought great joy to students of Hueneme Elementary. As the students enjoyed a week-long bicycle education program. Each day the students learned valuable skills on how to ride their bikes with more confidence and had an introduction on how to safely navigate through traffic on a safe course set up on their school's athletic field.

The students are instructed how to properly prepare and inspect their bikes and confirm they are in safe condition to ride. With the ABC quick check:

Air - squeeze tires to check air pressure

Brakes- squeeze brake levers to check engagement

Chain - inspect chain, cassette, and crankset for smooth, lubricated movement.

Then safety check themselves, with 'Head-to-toe' safety checklist: Learn to properly fit and adjust their helmet. Wear bright visible clothing. Tie and tuck in shoelaces and roll up baggy pants.

The one-week program allowed over 125 students an on-bike educational experience preparing them to safely ride and access their community. First time riders- about 30% of the students at the start were unable to balance and ride. By the end of the week all students were able to successfully ride the bicycles with a reasonable level of confidence.

Supporting this programming is meaningful to our cycling community as it has a direct impact on fostering and developing a next generation of cyclists. interested in the value of will.

We hope they will share our vision of making Ventura County to be the best and safest cycling county in California.



My Three-Week Bike Adventure in Ireland

How time flies! In May of 2019 I took a bike touring trip through the Republic of Ireland.

The trip lasted about three weeks. I started in Dublin and then took a train for a couple of hours to Sligo. As the saying goes "it's a small world." The manager of the RV park where I tent camped the first night had a brother that lived in Leisure Village in Camarillo and had visited here many times. From Sligo I headed South on my bike, the general direction for the remainder of my trip. I mostly camped in RV Parks with tent areas and a couple of times in hostels. Among the cities and towns I visited were Dublin, Sligo, Dingle, Ballina, Tralee, and Killarney. I pretty quickly settled into a routine of setting up camp in one location and then riding my Ritchey bike minus panniers, etc., on day long rides from my camp site.

Many of our members have been to Ireland and know how incredibly beautiful it is. I actually went back this year for a trip that involved very little cycling. It may be stating the obvious but driving along scenic roads couldn't compare to having ridden the same roads on a bike. I actually felt safer on my bike during my touring trip than when I drove around the country in a rental car. The Irish were exceptionally courteous on their very narrow roads when they encountered me on my bike. Also, on the bike I rode more often on rural roads, some so narrow that cars had to pull over to let the cars coming from the opposite direction pass. At times I would go an hour without even encountering a car.

The memories I had of the trip are equally of the beauty of the country and of the people I encountered. Perhaps because it was a solo trip people seemed very comfortable approaching me to ask about my trip and itinerary. A surprising number had visited the United States. I hung out for a few days in Tralee with a Swiss cyclist who had ridden all over the world and spoke five or six languages. I met a number of cyclists from Germany who had been to Ireland on multiple trips. The Irish I encountered were both very authentic and polite.

My Ireland trip in 2019 was a trip not to be forgotten. I haven't been able to do other similar trips since that time but enjoy hearing of the many trips abroad that our other club members have taken. If interested in more details about my trip, please visit:

Biking Ireland - the "Emerald Isle" By Kate Faulkner

Bill and I made our first visit to Ireland in May 2023. We love Ireland for the people, the scenery, the history, music and much more. We spent roughly two weeks traveling on our own, by foot or car, and two weeks bicycling with the Bicycle Adventure Club (BAC)

(www.bicycleadventureclub.org).

Our travels started and ended in Dublin. Dublin, the capitol of the Republic of Ireland, is full of history and worth several days of exploration.

We picked up a rental car to begin our broader explorations and head north from Dublin. When in a "left-side drive" country we like to pick up the car on a Sunday morning and hope for light traffic while adjusting to driving on the "wrong side" and the novel road signage. Bill was the driver. Fortunately, the traffic was light. However, once we left the main highway and began driving the narrow roads, the road markings and signage were confusing. It definitely requires two pairs of eyes to figure out driving in a foreign country. Bill learned quickly.


Our next major destination was Derry (or

"Londonderry" to the Unionists) in Northern Ireland. We would not have known that we crossed the border between the Republic of Ireland and Northern Ireland except for the fact that kilometers changed to miles on road signs.

The 25th anniversary of the Good Friday Agreement was celebrated this year. Northern Ireland is peaceful and beautiful to visit. However, tensions remain between Catholics (Republicans) and Protestants (Unionists). Overhearing locals in conversation it seemed that many people were angry and ready to get into a fight.



Temple Bar is the most popular historic district in Dublin. The original Guinness brewery, Trinity College, the oldest pub in Ireland, and the National Famine Museum are within walking distance from here.



As chance would have it, we were in Derry on the weekend of the coronation of King Charles of Great Britain. The Orangemen (Unionists) were marching and bands were playing in celebration of the coronation. The Catholics were burning pallets in protest. The police were ensuring the Catholics and Protestants did not cross the boundaries within the city that divide them. It was a wild and enlightening weekend for us. After returning to the U.S., I began watching "Derry Girls," which was wildly popular in Ireland. I would have thought the show was fiction and unconnected to reality if I hadn't actually experienced Derry in real life

Kate's story continued

Bill and I both have Irish ancestry.

As we headed south from Derry and explored the west coast of Ireland, we had great adventures locating and exploring ancestral villages, museums, and historic sites. The famine of the mid-1800s, largely an artifice of British greed and disdain for the Irish, drove the exodus of millions of starving Irish peasants to emigrate to the U.S. and other countries.

The second half of our Ireland visit was bicycling.....at least for me. Bill was still recovering from his broken collarbone and mostly drove our routes exploring the southwestern peninsulas of Ireland. However, Bill did manage to sneak a couple days riding on a spare e-bike.

Debbie Weniger, CIBike member, was our only friend participating in the BAC trip. As is typical on BAC tours, we quickly made many new friends and had a great time. The country roads of Ireland are ideal for cycling. They are very narrow and often do not have designated space for bicycles. However, cars and trucks were the most patient and polite drivers that I have experienced anywhere.

If you plan to visit Ireland, we have maps and itineraries to share.

Tim Turpin, who has visited and biked extensively in Ireland*, helped us with planning. Ireland is small, but diverse and fascinating. We highly recommend visiting Ireland at least once in your life!

Know the Laws – Ride Safely California Bicycle Laws and Crash Help

The California Vehicle Code (VEH) contains the state laws that specify where and how bikes must operate. For the most part, bicyclists have the same rights and responsibilities as motor vehicle drivers. (VEH 21200). For some specific rules, read the summarization of key sections in this Calbike article.

From Terry Spragg: Interesting series on cycling in Japan
